DESCRIPTION

Originally released as a private press in 1978 (but sounding more akin to 1970), this is a terrific example of British hard-rock/heavy-prog in the same vein as **Wishbone Ash** or **Thin Lizzy**, dominated by killer twin guitar attacks. With roots in the West Yorkshire pub rock scene and led by ace guitar player **Duncan McFarlane**, **Luigi Ana Da Boys** recorded their first album, *Feeling The Ceiling*, at a local studio in Leeds. 1000 copies were self-released in a plain white sleeve with a single-sided credits insert, as the band didn't have the money for a picture sleeve. One of those copies ended up with **John Peel**, who raved about the band and played a couple of songs at his radio show. The band eventually folded, giving birth to the **Duncan McFarlane Band** but over the years, there have been some Luigi reunions locally.
